Ballots for the March 5, 2024 Presidential Primary Election will be mailed beginning the week of February 12th.

Voter Service and Polling Center (VSPC) will open on Monday, February 26th.

This will be located in the Moffat County Courthouse.

- Hours are Monday through Friday 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
- Saturday, March 2nd, 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.
- Election Day, March 5th, 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

**Ballots must be received by 7:00 p.m. on Election Night. POSTMARKS DO NOT COUNT**

Ballots can be mailed back or dropped off at the following location during their regular business hours: 1198 West Victory Way Suite 105.

There is a 24-hour drop-off box in front of the Courthouse. Dropbox opens February 26<sup>th</sup>.

All voters who vote at the polls must provide identification. If you are voting by mail for the first time, you may also need to provide a photocopy of your identification when you return your ballot.

# Mail Ballot Election

---

Colorado law now allows for same-day voter registration as long as the voter meets the 22-day residency requirement and can provide an acceptable I.D. to vote their ballot. For those voters registering for the first time or changing precincts, application can be made in the County Clerk's office during regular business hours: Monday - Friday 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Replacement ballots can be obtained during those hours as well.

## 2024 Presidential Primary Election - Mail Ballot Election

- March 5, 2024 - Election Day
- Week of February 12, 2024 - Ballots mailed to all eligible - active voters within Moffat County.
- February 26, 2024 - Last day to apply for a ballot to be mailed. After this date, you must apply in person at the Moffat County Courthouse VSPC.

All voters who vote at the polls must provide identification. If you are voting by mail for the first time, you may also need to provide a photocopy of your identification when you return your mail ballot.

### **The following documents are acceptable forms of identification:**

- A valid Colorado driver's license or valid identification card issued by the Colorado Department of Revenue. (Note: documents issued to not lawfully present and temporarily lawfully present individuals under Part 5 of Article 2 of Title 42, C.R.S. are not acceptable forms of identification.)
- A valid U.S. passport.
- A valid employee identification card with a photograph of the eligible elector issued by any branch, department, agency, or entity of the U.S. government or of Colorado, or by any county, municipality, board, authority, or other political subdivision of Colorado.
- A valid pilot's license issued by the federal aviation administration or other authorized agency of the U.S.
- A valid U.S. military identification card with a photograph of the eligible elector.

- A copy of a current (within the last 60 days) utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document that shows the name and address of the elector.
- A Certificate of Degree of Indian or Alaskan Native Blood.
- A valid Medicare or Medicaid card issued by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.
- A certified copy of a U.S. birth certificate for the elector.
- Certified documentation of naturalization.
- A valid student identification card with a photograph of the eligible elector issued by an institute of higher education in Colorado, as defined in section 23-3.1-102(5), C.R.S.
- A valid Veteran Identification Card issued by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, Veterans Health Administration, with a photograph of the eligible elector.
- A valid identification card issued by a federally recognized tribal government certifying tribal membership.

Any form of identification listed above that shows your address must show a Colorado address to qualify as an acceptable form of identification.
