**Call to Order  
Emergency County Board of Public Health Meeting**

**10:30 am**

Beck called the emergency (Resolution 2020-31) Board of Public Health meeting to order. The purpose of this meeting is to review Moffat County's waiver request documents to re-open the County after the Stay-At-Home order expires. This is based on declining COVID-19 cases over a period of 14 days, no deaths, etc. and must be submitted by Friday, May 1. The letter that accompanies this plan must be signed off by the Board of Public Health, the Public Health Director, the Public Health Medical Officer and the local hospital.

- The State has instituted the "Safer at Home" Executive Order beginning April 27.
- Beck feels it's important that Moffat County get their application in ASAP, because there are probably a lot of other counties that will be submitting theirs at the same time.
- The City and the County hosted a Zoom meeting last week with the local restaurant owners/operators to get their views on possible reopening.
- Mesa County & Eagle County had their exemption plans approved.
- Beck said it's important that the community realizes that the Commissioners and the Board of Public Health are working to get things opened back up.

Kari Ladrow said she wanted to hear from the MRH representatives first to clarify if they would be prepared with PPE's and supplies if there were to be a surge.

Andy Daniels replied that they were prepared, but asked if necessary, could this waiver be reversed? The answer was yes.

- It was decided that restaurants and bars should not be included in Phase I.
- There was discussion about the process involved in opening up local retail and personal service(s) businesses. Access to the required PPE's and sanitation products was pointed out as being problematic at this time.

It was decided that the documents would be reviewed one last time by the team and at a meeting tomorrow, the final version would be put together to be sent off.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:15 a.m.
